Section two concludes by outlining processes for evaluating programs including setting goals collecting appropriate data and methods of analysis and by offering advice on sustaining and institutionalizing programs. Each chapter opens with a case study illustrating its principal points. This book is primarily intended as a resource for student affairs professionals and program coordinators who are developing new peer mentoring programs or considering refining existing ones. It may also serve as a text in courses designed to train future peer mentors and leaders.
