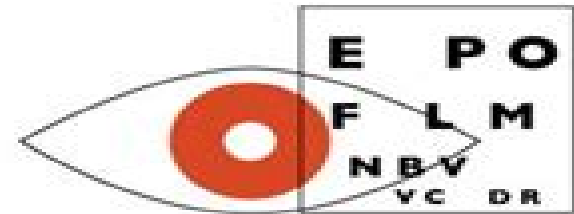


Pediatric Eye Care: Testing Your Child's Eyes

We want to make sure that your child's entire visual system is healthy and they are experiencing the best vision possible.

We tailor your child's exam to their age, needs and abilities in order to create a positive eye care experience that gives us as much information as possible about your child's vision and eye health. Here's how:



- 1 Matching Your Child's Energy-** Each kid we work with has a unique and wonderful personality. If your child's shy, we'll be quiet and gentle during their exam. If they're excited and hyper, we'll have fun and won't be afraid to get a little loud during our exam!
- 2 Testing Visual Acuity and 3D vision-** For pre-verbal children and those who can't read, we offer special card-based tests with pictures instead of letters. We then observe if your child registers the images on the cards. Once they can read and identify letters, a normal Snellen chart is used.!
- 3 Testing Muscles Around the Eye -** In adults, we check eye muscle movement by asking the patient to follow a pen as the eye doctor moves it around. With children, we use something a bit more interesting, such as dolls, light-up toys and pictures, to gauge if your child can follow with their eyes.
- 4 Dilating Drops? No Biggie!** – We know that dilating drops can be scary and uncomfortable for some kids. When they're necessary, we make sure your child knows they're no big deal. We liken it to splashing water in their eyes during bathtime and keep them talking so they don't think too hard about it.
- 5 We're Not Afraid to Put On A Show!**- If it sets your child's mind at ease, we don't mind doing a bit of singing, telling jokes, and generally making your child's eye exam a fun experience all around!
