 - More treatment referrals for high risk youth
 - 75% of offenders are high risk
 - At least five services available targeting criminogenic needs
 - Separate groups by risk
 - 20 hours or more of treatment per week
 - Program ranged 3 to 9 months
 - Provided quality aftercare
 - Had a manual
 - Adhered to manual
 - Staff hired for skills and values
 - Pre/post testing of offenders
