In essence ecoaesthetics is the pursuit of the endless cycling of bio engendering which is the main goal of ecoaesthetics Cheng Xiangzhan is outstanding among Chinese environmental aestheticians in joining classical and contemporary Western environmental aesthetics with his original contributions to the more recent work by Chinese scholars Cheng's creative and integrative accomplishments are supported by a remarkable facility in English and reflected in his original and systematic consideration of the outstanding issues While much can be debated there is substantial material here and this book makes a signal contribution to carrying the discussion forward Arnold Berleant distinguished environmental aesthetician His latest book *The Social Aesthetics of Human Environments* will appear in September 2023
