commitments in the public realm Rougeau offers concerned Christians new tools for a critical assessment of legal political and social questions He proceeds from the fundamental Christian premise of the God given dignity of the human person a dignity that can only be realized fully in community with others This means that the Christian cannot simply focus on individual empowerment as freedom but must also seek to nurture community participation and solidarity for all citizens Rougeau demonstrates what happens when these ideas are applied to a variety of specific contemporary issues involving the family economics and race He concludes by offering a new model of public engagement for Christians in the American Empire
