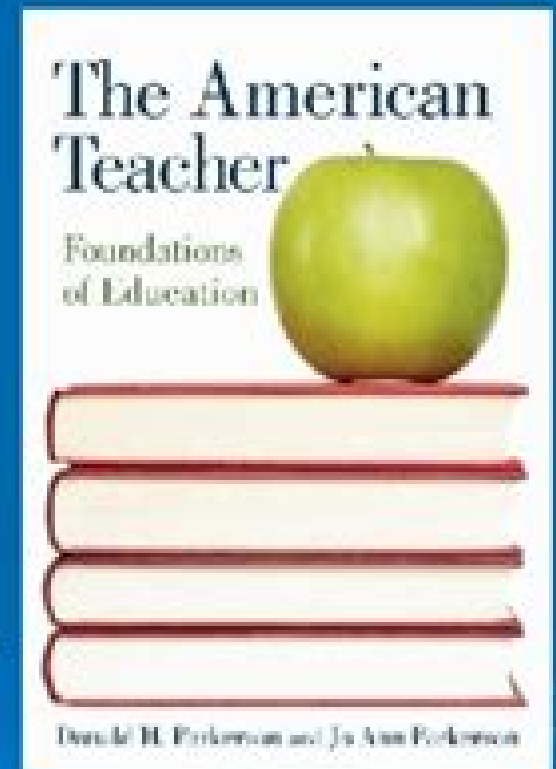


The Multicultural Curriculum
