

Versions of retellings of books read or films seen (as in Chafe, 1980) would therefore have been discourses much more comparable to the guidebook genre.

The above criticism of Virtanen's study should not detract from the general usefulness of the discourse-related approach in the area of language and literature. Virtanen must be given her due for having struggled (wo)manfully to come to terms with largely irreconcilable theoretical models. For a licentiate thesis the book is certainly an achievement, and one needs to be grateful to the author for having chosen such a controversial topic, thereby contributing to an ongoing scholarly debate and to a discipline that is still in the making.

Hardy's Literary Language and Victorian Philology

Hardy's literary language is an attractive subject. He wrote poetry, novels and prose, many of his notebooks and letters survive, and a large number of books from his library, often with his marginal annotations, are available in various collections. So it is hardly surprising that Dennis Taylor, after his book on *Hardy's Metres and Victorian Prosody* (1988), should turn his attention to Hardy's language. His starting point is the widespread acceptance that Hardy's language is awkward and he looks for answers as to why this is so. He sees in Hardy a man rooted in history who was increasingly separated from those scholars and writers who were turning their attention towards an acceptance of the synchronic nature of language. Hardy was himself brought up in a dialect-speaking area of the country and he does not fit easily into the group who accepted the 'language of the tribe', although he recognised that the standard language had to be his medium for communication. This led him to question the relation between the past of a language and its present expression, and how or even if these two could be combined in some synthesis. Taylor sees an important similarity between the way a literary author and a lexicographer work, for the latter charts the history of words and the former exploits this information in deciding which words to use. This in turn has evidently affected the way this book is written and what it contains.
