Pletcher, 2001 Annotation Like its predecessor this important new work is focused on the connection between trade and investment on the one hand and U S foreign policy on the other David Pletcher describes the trade of the United States with the Far East the islands of the Pacific and the northwest coast of North America from 1784 the year of the first American trading expedition to China to 1844 the year of the first trade treaty with China followed immediately by the U S acquisition of Oregon and California He then traces the growth of trade and investment in Alaska Hawaii and the South Pacific from 1844 to 1890 and proceeds to do the same for China Japan and Korea In the ensuing chapters Pletcher covers the 1890s including the annexation of Hawaii the Sino Japanese War the acquisition of the Philippines and the Open Door policy in China He concludes that the American expansion across the Pacific and into the Far East was not a deliberate consistent drive for economic hegemony but a halting experimental improvised movement carried out against determined opposition and indifference and dotted with setbacks and failures Providing his own judgments about the wisdom and effectiveness of America's new endeavors Pletcher summarizes the problems and handicaps involved demonstrating that errors of the twentieth century were at least partly the result of poor preparation in the 1880s and 1890s Touching on every place where Americans undertook significant economic activity The Diplomacy of Involvement will be an important aid for seasoned scholars as well as an excellent introduction for the novice

**The Hawaiian Kingdom—Volume 2** Ralph S. Kuykendall, 1953-01-01 The colorful history of the Hawaiian Islands since their discovery in 1778 by the great British navigator Captain James Cook falls naturally into three periods During the first Hawaii was a monarchy ruled by native kings and queens Then came the perilous transition period when new leaders after failing to secure annexation to the United States set up a miniature republic The third period began in 1898 when Hawaii by annexation became American territory The Hawaiian Kingdom by Ralph S. Kuykendall is the detailed story of the island monarchy In the first volume Foundation and Transformation the author gives a brief sketch of old Hawaii before the coming of the Europeans based on the known and accepted accounts of this early period He then shows how the arrival of sea rovers traders soldiers of fortune whalers scoundrels missionaries and statesmen transformed the native kingdom and how the foundations of modern Hawaii were laid

In the second volume *Twenty Critical Years* the author deals with the middle period of the kingdom's history when Hawaii was trying to insure her independence while world powers maneuvered for dominance in the Pacific. It was an important period with distinct and well marked characteristics but the noteworthy changes and advances which occurred have received less attention from students of history than they deserve. Much of the material is taken from manuscript sources and appears in print for the first time in the second volume. The third and final volume of this distinguished trilogy *The Kalakaua Dynasty* covers the colorful reign of King Kalakaua the Merry Monarch and the brief and tragic rule of his successor Queen Liliuokalani. This volume is enlivened by such controversial personages as Claus Spreckels, Walter Murray Gibson and Celso Caesar Moreno. Through it runs the thread of the reciprocity treaty with the United States, its stimulating effect upon the island economy and the far reaching consequences of immigration from the Orient to supply plantation labor. The trilogy closes with the events leading to the downfall of the Hawaiian monarchy and the establishment of the Provisional Government in 1893.

*American Sugar Kingdom* César J. Ayala, 2009-11-15 Engaging conventional arguments that the persistence of plantations is the cause of economic underdevelopment in the Caribbean, this book focuses on the discontinuities in the development of plantation economies in Cuba, Puerto Rico and the Dominican Republic in the early twentieth century. Cesar Ayala analyzes and compares the explosive growth of sugar production in the three nations following the War of 1898 when the U.S. acquired Cuba and Puerto Rico to show how closely the development of the Spanish Caribbean's modern economic and social class systems is linked to the history of the U.S. sugar industry during its greatest period of expansion and consolidation. Ayala examines patterns of investment and principal groups of investors, interactions between U.S. capitalists and native planters, contrasts between new and old regions of sugar monoculture, the historical formation of the working class on sugar plantations and patterns of labor migration. In contrast to most studies of the Spanish Caribbean which focus on only one country, his account places the history of U.S. colonialism in the region and the history of plantation agriculture across the region in comparative perspective.
