Change Forces Michael Fullan, 1999 Fullan's first book on this subject was an instant and best selling success. Now in Change Forces The Sequel he extends and expands the use of chaos theory as a lens through which to view and comprehend change and the forces which govern it. Educators have already widely embraced this approach and taken on board the idea that change is not so straightforward as we might hope. As Fullan worked on his ideas relating them to school systems, higher education and research, the field of change forces was also developing significantly. This volume covers new aspects of this science of complexity and helps educators obtain insights for delving deeper into moral purpose and expanding into fresh dimensions of changing forces in the environment. The first volume appealed to a wide market from classroom teachers through school administrators to student teachers and academics. This volume will appeal to a similar cross section.

Educating for Radical Social Transformation in the Climate Crisis Stuart Tannock, 2021-09-21 This book asks how education can be developed to facilitate the radical social, cultural and economic transformations needed to deal with the ongoing climate emergency. The author illuminates important links between the work currently being done in climate change and education and the broader and older theories of radical education, an area of education theory and practice that has long grappled with the question of how to use education to create a more just society. Highlighting both current work and long traditions that include popular, progressive, feminist, anti-racist and anti-colonial education, the author draws on interdisciplinary research to make the case for how radical education can help tackle the climate change crisis. It will have direct relevance for scholars of environmental education and radical education as well as activists and practitioners.

The Change Agent's Guide to Innovation in Education Ronald G. Havelock, 1973 *Can Education Change Society?* Michael W. Apple, 2013 Despite the vast differences between the Right and the Left over the role of education in the production of inequality, one common element both sides share is a sense that education can and should do something about society, to either restore what is being lost or radically alter what is there now. The question was perhaps put most succinctly by the radical educator George Counts in 1932 when he asked: Dare the School Build a New Social Order, challenging entire generations of educators to participate in, actually to lead, the reconstruction of society. Over 70 years later, celebrated educator, author and activist Michael Apple revisits Counts' now iconic work, compares them to the equally powerful voices of minoritized people and again asks the seemingly simple question of whether education truly has the power to change society. In this groundbreaking work, Apple pushes educators toward a more substantial understanding of what schools do and what we can do to challenge the relations of dominance and subordination in the larger society.
