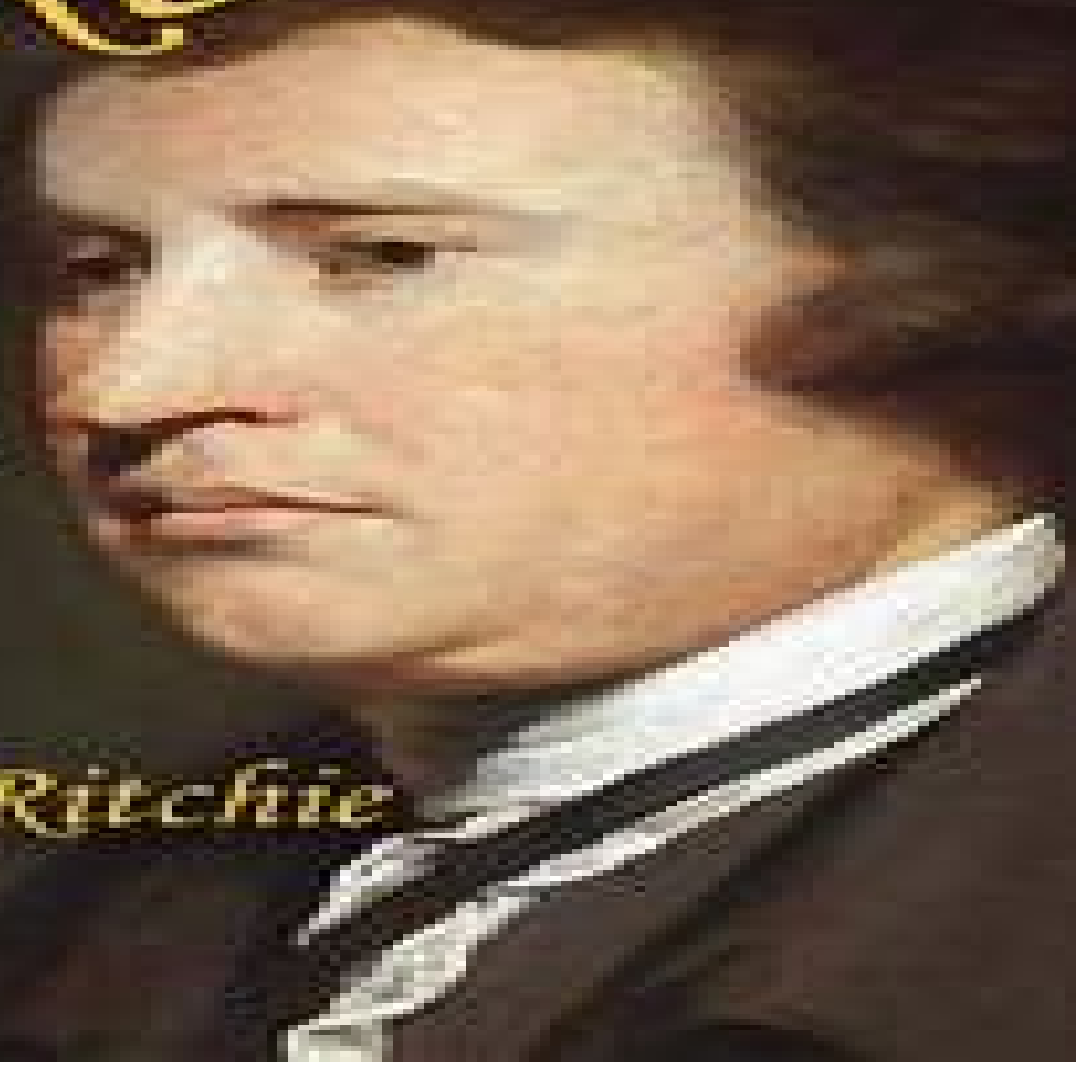

**Edmund Burke** Peter James Stanlis, Two centuries after Edmund Burke published his *Reflections on the Revolution in France* his name and reputation stand alongside Locke Montesquieu and Hume the other still cited grand political thinkers of the eighteenth century For those great nations that have fallen into what Burke called the antagonist world of madness discord vice confusion and unavailing sorrow the work of Burke supplies that sense of order justice and freedom the present age seems to require This volume by Peter Stanlis has grown out of almost four decades of studying Burke Today Professor Stanlis is called by Russell Kirk the leading American authority on the political thought of the great conservative reformer The book is divided into three categories Burke on law and politics Burke's criticism of Enlightenment rationalism and sensibility and Burke's theory of revolution and critique of the English revolution of 1688 Stanlis reasons for linking Burke to the English Revolution rather than the later and admittedly more decisive American and French Revolutions of his own time is that for Burke that earlier event was the normative pivot for judging how to make important changes in civil society Indeed even in his writings on the contemporary revolutions of his time Stanlis reminds us that Burke interpreted revolutionary events in France and America through the prism of the bloodless Revolution of 1688

Edmund Burke and the Invention of Modern Conservatism, 1830-1914 Emily Jones, 2017 Between 1830 and 1914 in Britain a dramatic modification of the reputation of Edmund Burke 1730 1797 occurred Burke an Irishman and Whig politician is now most

Hindus, 2018-04-24 This book, originally published as *The Old East Side*, is a collection of literature and documents ranging from the autobiography of the sculptor Jacob Epstein and the novels of Abraham Cahan to the reporting of William Dean Howells and the fictional reconstruction of a vanished world by Henry Roth. The world is that of the old shtetl transplanted to a new, growing country where the ghetto in the years 1881-1924 was an unstable mixture of nostalgic elements and the pressures of American economic and social reality. The productivity, both intellectual and material, of the section of New York known as the East Side during those forty years around the turn of the twentieth century has become a legend among many Jews in this country and deserves to become better known to many more of other ethnic origins. The lower East Side was paradoxically a wilderness to be traversed and a portion of that promised land which had been glimpsed with so much hope from afar. To wonderfully talented and observant children like Jacob Epstein, the streets there in the 1880s were as filled with excitement as those of the Arabian Nights. To serious philosophic young men like Morris Raphael Cohen, they were as challenging as the marketplace of Athens had once been to Socrates, to achieve intellectual enlightenment and the



improvement of the social order The conditions of abominable crowding and poverty described in the sociological tracts of Jacob Riis Lillian Wald and others are better known perhaps to the average reader than the accounts of such pleasures as the dancing schools the Yiddish theaters the cafes the lectures the literary ferment and activities described in the pages of Abraham Cahan and Hutchins Hapgood But all the views presented in The Jewish East Side both dark and bright are recognizably parts of the same picture This book will be of value to sociologists historians researchers specializing in Judaic studies and students of literature

The Structure of Political Thought Charles N. R. McCoy, 2017-07-05 Originally published in 1963 this classic book is a rethinking of the history of Western political philosophy Charles N R McCoy contrasts classical medieval principles against the hypotheses at the root of modern liberalism and modern conservatism In Part I The Classical Christian Tradition from Plato to Aquinas the author lays the foundation for a philosophical structure capable of producing constitutional liberty Part II The Modern Theory of Politics from Machiavelli to Marx attempts to show beginning with Machiavelli the reversal and destruction of the pre modern structure postulated in Part I McCoy stresses the great contributions of Aristotle to political thought found in his more familiar Ethics and Politics but also includes key insights drawn from Metaphysics and Physics These contributions are developed and perfected McCoy argues by Augustine and Aquinas Two other important features include McCoy s epistemological insights into Plato s work that will be new to many readers and the author s juxtaposition of traditional natural law with the modernized theory of natural law The modern account of autonomous natural law in McCoy s view helps explain the totalitarian direction of key aspects of modern political thought This classic volume on the origins of modern philosophical thought remains a standard in the field

Moral Phenomena Nicolai Hartmann, 2017-09-29 Since the nineteenth century moral philosophy in the Western world has been dominated by utilitarianism Kantianism and relativism Only a few philosophers have been able to escape from this Procrustean bed Foremost among these few is Nicolai Hartmann 1882 1950 Together with Henri Bergson and Martin Heidegger Hartmann was instrumental in restoring metaphysics Hartmann s metaphysics differs markedly from that of both Bergson and Heidegger in his indebtedness to Plato In 1926 Hartmann published a massive treatise Ethik which was translated into English by Stanton Coit and published as Ethics in 1932 Ethics is probably the most outstanding treatise on moral philosophy in the twentieth century The central concept of the book is value Drawing upon the pre modern view of ethics Hartmann maintains that values are objectively given part and parcel of the order of being We cannot invent values we can merely discover them The first part of Ethics is concerned with the structure of ethical phenomena and criticizes utilitarianism Kantianism and relativism as misleading approaches After some introductory thoughts concerning the competence of practical philosophy Hartmann discusses the essence of moral values including their absoluteness and ideal being and the essence of the ought Hartmann is both controversial and compelling He provides a moral philosophy that rejects the subjectivism of the ruling approaches without taking recourse to older theological notions on the foundation of the

ethical In sum Hartmann's Ethics constitutes an impressive and preeminent contribution to moral philosophy
