

PUBLIC HEALTH POLICY

DEFINITION

Public health policy refers to the decisions, actions, and strategies taken by governments or health organizations to achieve specific health care goals within a society. It is a plan of action to tackle health challenges and improve the well-being of the population. These policies are designed to protect and promote the health of communities as a whole.

EXAMPLES

- **Vaccination Programs:** Governments implement policies to ensure that citizens receive vaccinations against preventable diseases like measles or polio.
- **Nutrition Labeling:** Regulations require food manufacturers to display nutritional information on product packaging to inform consumers about food quality.
